# Chairman's Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors, it is pleasing (and somewhat relieving) to report to our members that Briars Sports had ridden the roller coaster of 2020 without too much drama and remains in a sustainable and solid position for all our sporting teams and for the Club itself.

Importantly, our sports continue to go from strength to strength with Cricket, Rugby, Hockey, Squash, Netball and Bowls in their senior and junior ranks for men's and ladies, boys and girls, navigating the challenges that presented within their sports during this unique year. Our winter sports were especially impacted however through the dedication of the volunteers who run our sports, all our sports completed a season.

In the community of Concord, all throughout the year, you will see our teams participating on the various sporting fields.

Briars Sports is in an improved financial position notwithstanding the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic that occupied all our lifestyles during the year. There were many issues to be addressed however through the commitment, patience, and understanding of many, the Club is as strong as it ever has been.

At the outset of my report, it is very important to note that during the year we lost 2 very important members.

Gerard Price OAM passed-away at 57 in December 2020 after battling illness. Gerard was an extraordinary person and Briar. A cricketer for over 40 years and cricket chairman for the last 31 years he will rightly be remembered as one of Briars most respected and influential members due to his devoted contribution to Cricket, as both a player and an administrator. In the June 2020 Queen's Birthday honours, Gerard was deservedly awarded an OAM for Services to cricket and the community. In October 2020, the award was presented to him by the NSW Governor with his family present then appropriate celebrations at the Club afterwards. Briars Cricket will never be the same without Gerard.

Keith Free OAM passed-away in December 2020 aged 91. Keith was a co-patron of Briars Sports and commenced bowling for Greenlees Park Bowling Club in 1965. He was an integral and important part of men's bowls over the decades including being in many pennant winning sides. Keith was further recognised by the Club by having a bowling green named in his honour.

Further details on both Gerard's and Keith's significant contributions are contained elsewhere in this report. The club also notes the passing of other members during the year including Peter Walker, John Morlock and Ray "Tiger" Coombes and we offer condolences to their families.

Across the sporting fields, courts and greens, some highlights from each of our sports during the year are detailed below.

## Senior Cricket:

Cricket achieved its record-breaking 8<sup>th</sup> successive Club Championship, but the season was unexpectedly cut short after the qualifying final due to the outbreak of Covid-19. At that time, all 4 shires sides had progressed to the semi-finals and were very confident of premiership success but that was not to be.

#### Junior Cricket:

The Club had 46 teams (over 400 players) playing across three associations. This included seven girl's teams, a continued growth area. Numerous teams made the semi-finals and grand finals with 5 Premiership winning teams.

#### Senior Rugby:

Briars Senior Rugby's request to be promoted to Division 3 was approved. The 2020 Rugby year got off to a good start with solid numbers at preseason, The Walker Cup was retained by Briars over St Ives (which was the last game ever to be played on the old Concord Oval) and a runners-up trophy in the Cowra 10's.

On the field they exceeded expectations, envisioning they would finish 6 or 7<sup>th</sup> place in a new division in the Club Championship, finishing up the season in 4<sup>th</sup> position, the enthusiasm this has generated within Briars Rugby is fantastic.

Briars Women's Rugby enjoyed an extraordinarily strong year with record numbers participating.

#### Junior Rugby:

The Junior Rugby numbers were strong in the mini's teams, fielding 2 Under 6's, an Under 7's, Under 8's and Under 9's team. The gold jerseys stood out strong on St Luke's Park every Saturday morning, where they managed a 10-round season. Junior Rugby also fielded an Under 11's and Under 13's in the Sydney Junior Rugby Union competition playing Sunday mornings, and while their beloved home ground Rothwell Park was out of action for the season, they were thrilled to be able to play their home games at another top-quality ground in the Canada Bay area, by using St Luke's 3 (but cannot wait to get back onto Rothwell in Season 2021).

#### Men's Bowls:

While impacting on the Pennants competition, the virus also disrupted the Club competitions to some extent. Whilst necessitating a rejig of the initial calendar proposed for the year, they were able to successfully complete the majority of their Club competitions, with thanks to all the participants who made it work. Congratulations to the winners of the Major and Minor events, Triples and Fours and Mixed Pairs.

#### Women's Bowls:

Welcomed six new members this year, bringing their total membership to 38. They also have some more ladies interested in joining GPWBC in 2021, which is exciting, considering a few years back they only had 12 regular players and now have at least 30 regular players on a Thursday. Women's Bowls entered two grades in Pennants. Grade 4 ended the season as runners up to the winners, Carlingford. The women's grade 2 team unfortunately did not get a place, but a good effort was made by all.

#### **Briars Netball:**

Successfully registered a record 345 Players and 41 teams into the IWSNA winter competition. This included 6 Senior, 26 Junior and 9 modified teams. Briars Netball also registered 46 participants in their development program for 5-7-year old's. All the teams excelled, attaining 5 premierships and 5 teams finishing up the season as runners up.

#### Briars Squash:

Making the best of a bad situation the COVID-19 lockdown allowed them to strategize, plan and make player experiences even better. As a result, squash is now in the strongest position they have ever been, with a growing community and strengthening club with 8 accredited coaches and volunteers available for training their juniors and seniors. 2021 performances are keenly anticipated.

#### **Briars Hockey**

Managed to field plenty of teams; six senior men's teams (with one premiership in 5<sup>th</sup> Grade / PL4), five senior women's teams (with one premiership for the Women's Social Team), 11 junior teams (with two premierships for the U11 and U15C's), and three men's master's teams (with one premiership for the Sydney Cup / 2<sup>nd</sup> Division team). Importantly a coaching sub-committee was formed to drive the recruitment

of top-level coaches in 2021, plus the development of systems and resources to flow down through all levels of the Club.

In the early part of 2020, Briars Sports was enjoying record trading prior to the Club ceasing trade on 23 March 2020 for a 10-week period. There were some initial dark times during this period as, at the time, it was unclear exactly how long the lockdown would last. However, the Club took this as an opportunity to rejig a few things internally to improve member amenity with pleasing results. Upon reopening on 1 June, the Club quickly sought to regain any lost ground and is well on the way to achieving this. I refer you to the Treasurer's report by Matina Moffitt for a more detailed explanation of the Club's financial performance during the year.

A special mention must go to our General Manager Jason Parle during this time. As COVID-19 took hold Jason's work ethic was tireless as he sought to not only make sure that Briars Sports got through the shutdown, but also bounce back stronger and brighter than before. Through his hard work and that of all our staff this has been achieved.

Due to our strong and responsible financial foundations, Briars Sports was able to provide all our sports with total grants exceeding \$150,000 during 2019/20. This was an extraordinary achievement in the context of the year. These funds were invested by our sports in equipment, coaching, training and the like and to assist in keeping costs lower for our sporting participants.

Our volunteers that run our sports remain the success of our existence. It starts with either the Chairman or Chairwomen who lead their respective sport. Only they truly know the time and effort they put into running their sport. Next in line are the respective committees, coaches and managers that ensure that all that is required to get done, gets done. Also, a special thanks to all the parents, grandparents and other supporters that help all our juniors get to training or game day.

Of special note, Anne Burt retired as netball Chairwoman during the year. After a significant contribution with junior cricket, Anne was instrumental in re-invigorating netball within the club and growing it to its

current strength. Her untiring efforts over the years have been rewarded with a successful, well-run and well-respected sport. Thanks, and well-done Anne for all your effort over the years.

Mick Laws also stood down as Men Bowls chairman and a thank you to Mick for all his hard work during that time as well.

Additionally, I would like to make a special mention to, and thank all our sporting participants for it is you that make Briars Sports the success it is. We have a proud and unique history of over 100 years as an amateur sporting Club and we look to all your ongoing participation to make sure that continues.

Our sponsors provide an important ingredient as part of the viability of our sports. We thank you for your valued support of all our sports.

The Club is most fortunate to enjoy the facilities provided by the City of Canada Bay Council. We appreciate all the support provided to our sports by the various council officers together with their General Manager Peter Gainsford and Mayor Angelo Tsirekas. Our sporting fields and facilities are the envy of many of our opposition sides and we sincerely thank Council for their efforts.

The Briars Foundation has had a quiet year with several personnel changes amongst directors. As part of her role, new chairwoman Emma Ratcliffe will look to reset the agenda for the Foundation during 2021.

The Board recognises the importance of memorabilia to its sporting members and has invested in this regard in recent times. At the time of writing new initiatives are well underway within the Club to ensure an appropriate presentation of memorabilia is presented for the benefit of members.

Our senior staff of Jason, Monique, Jack, Megan, Ben and Jeff and all the remaining bar staff deserve a special recognition all for their efforts during the year we have just had. As a community-based Club, we especially reply upon our staff who are at the coalface with our members. I thank them for their efforts during a difficult year.

Our bistro, The Backyard, with Adam and Tiffiny also had a challenging year but managed to get through the peaks and troughs and are now enjoying better times. The Backyard provides a great environment for members, guests and especially the children and I encourage your patronage.

It goes without saying that the Board had a few unexpected challenges during the year. That said, with the communication, cooperation, and experience of all Board members the Club is very well placed for the future with various initiatives being investigated. I sincerely thank my fellow Board members for their support and contributions and look forward to another productive year ahead in 2021.

Ian Blair stood down at the February 2020 AGM. Ian is the immediate past Chairman and was a long-term board member who also has a long association with the Club. Terry O'Kane has advised of his intention not to seek re-election in 2021. Thanks, are extended to both Ian and Terry for their valued contributions during their time as directors. At the 2020 AGM we welcomed new Board members John Price and Kylie Beckhouse who have already provided respected contributions over the last 12 months.

On behalf of the Board, I wish to thank all members for their support during this unprecedented year. Briars Sports exists to provide both various sporting opportunities and a Club for our community to be involved in. We thank you for your participation and patronage and look forward to seeing you on the sporting field or in the Club sometime during 2021.

# Treasurer's Report

It is with great pleasure I present to you the Treasurer's report for the year ended 30 September 2020. This year has been a hard year for many and hopefully we will see a better 2021.

The profit for the year was \$488,994 compared to the prior year result of \$353,214.

This year was a challenging year for all Clubs and in many ways, we were unsure of the impact on the Club. However, our financial year ended on an incredibly positive note and with very unexpected results. bar revenue decreased by 2% and poker machine revenue remained steady. I am also happy to announce that the Club's cash flow remains strong with no debt and our cash reserves are growing, as at end of financial year we have \$465,000.

Several Club upgrades were also undertaken during the financial year and our objective is to continue to invest on Club capital upgrades over the next twelve months to ensure we remain relevant to our patrons.

In addition, the 2020 financial year profit does not include the profits made by the sports, which was \$392,783 compared to \$219,206 last year. These amounts are carried forward to 2021 to assist the sports with their upcoming seasons.

As always, we continue to support our sports with overall funding to them amounting to \$150,000 for the year (this amount excludes the funding of the Bowling Green's upkeep).

I would like to acknowledge our Club members for their continued support. Likewise, a big thank you to all the volunteers who worked tirelessly to ensure that the sports were able to take the field and participate in a stressful time.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Jason Parle, our General Manager, the Briars management team Ben, Jack, Monique, Megan and Jeff, the Backyard and my fellow directors for their huge contribution that has seen the Club perform well during a difficult year.

# General Manager's Report

There have been many changes to the Club and the way we conduct our business over the past 12 months. Some have been forced upon us, some have been rushed through due to circumstance. All, though, have been positive in one way or another.

The ATM found a new home and a cashier counter complete with TAB and Keno facilities has streamlined the service in this area. Jack spreads his workload through Sports administrator and Supervisor duties. A huge thank you to all for your efforts!

To Jeff, Kim, the two Will's, the two Jess's, Sam (who was instrumental in creating the mural on the Ted Stockdale deck) Jarrod and George, thank you for your help throughout the year.

Tiffiny and Adam at the Backyard have had a difficult year and yet have come through with their food offering as popular as ever. I encourage all members and your guests to keep supporting Tiffiny and Adam, my thanks to you both.

I will leave the finances of the Club to our Treasurer, Matina Moffitt and the Sports to the individual Chairs except to say that, obviously, these two are linked. Our Sports continue to support the Club and the Club will always support our Sports. My thanks are extended to all Briars Sports and I wish you every success for your individual seasons.

# Sports Administrator's Report

I would like to start by acknowledging the difficult circumstances community sport was placed in during the year 2020. Whilst it heaped extra work and a lot of unknown circumstances and procedures on mid-week and match day processes, the strong 'Briars Spirit' was quickly identified. This has helped each sport through this difficult period and provided the opportunity to come out of the Covid19 period stronger than ever before. Moving on from Covid19 discussions, below were a few highlights from throughout the year.

 Junior Rugby saw an increase of one team growing from 6 teams to 7 teams in total. It was also very encouraging that Briars fielded an U/13's team which highlights that kids are progressing through the Briars ranks and hopefully down the track will graduate into the Seniors!

- Senior Rugby continued their rise and moved up a division into Division 3 in the NSW Suburban Rugby Competition. A rise in division didn't stop progression as the Briars finished 4<sup>th</sup> overall in the Club Championship, an outstanding achievement. The enormous growth in the men's U/21's and Women's Rugby 7's numbers was also outstanding to see for the club moving forward.
- Senior Cricket saw yet another successful season culminating in winning their 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive club championship. This is an amazing achievement and a strong reflection of those involved both on and off the field.
- Junior cricket had another fantastic season with 46 teams (5 teams more than last year) competing for the Briars. The club had a total of 7 junior girl's teams, an increase on the 4 teams from last year which now has us recognised by Cricket Australia as a leading club in the growth of girl's cricket across the country.
- Hockey were able to field 24 teams across seniors and juniors with over 300 players participating. The club went on to secure premiership's in 5 grades. Briars Hockey did an extraordinary job and continue to do so in running the Cintra Hockey Complex throughout the Covid19 restrictions. As a Premier Sydney Hockey Field Facility this was paramount for all Hockey Clubs across Sydney.
- Netball had a fantastic season with 345 players registering to play Netball for Briars. This was a new record for playing numbers. Briars went on to record 5 premierships in the junior ranks. Amazingly, the Briars NetSetGo Netstars Junior Development program went ahead with 50 juniors participating between the age of 5-7 years old.
- Briars Squash was able to use the time to plan and strategise for future years as Squash numbers were continuing to rise before the abrupt closure of indoor venues. In big news, the squash centre at Thornleigh has received a \$960,000 Government Grant to completely update and modernise the Centre.
- Men's and Ladies Bowls was heavily affected during 2020 with many major events being cancelled although we did see an increase in participation numbers for Social Bowls. We were also unable to host the Junior Bowls program with local schools, but I will ensure that this is back up and running as soon as restrictions allow.

The underlying message above is that the junior programs of Briars Sports are thriving even during what was a difficult year which places the club in a great position moving forward and is a testament to all those involved!

Grants applications across the sports are another important source of income for community sport and Briars was successful in a number of grants across 2020. These are generally sourced from all Major Sport Governing Bodies, from Local and State Governments, ClubGrants NSW and in recent times WestConnex. I was successful in a total of \$112,290 in grant applications over the 2020 year which was an outstanding result. This is broken down as follows:

- \$88,000 for the construction of new cricket nets at Fivedock Park to cater for the continued growth of Junior girls and boys playing cricket in the local area.
- \$6,000 total divided up for each individual sport through the NSW office of Sport
- \$6,040 towards costs and growth of the newly introduced Briars Women's Rugby 7's Club
- \$5,000 towards junior Netball equipment and expenses
- \$7,250 for grassroots cricket and continued girls junior cricket growth

Currently there is over \$38,000 of grant funding that has been applied for across all the Sports here at Briars that is waiting to be assessed and an outcome delivered back to the club.

I would like to extend a big thank you to all sports volunteers and specifically the committee members of each sport. Without your tireless efforts, community sport does not go ahead in what you could term a 'normal' year, let alone a year so heavily affected by Covid19. To all the club sponsors, thank you for your continued support of our junior and senior clubs. It is much appreciated.

Lastly, I'd like to thank the local Canada Bay Council for their work in making 2020 community sport go ahead. From field markings and posts, field/court flood lights, the closure of major sporting fields with the

intention of creating an outstanding sporting facility (Rothwell Park) which created scheduling nightmares, and also the general upkeep and maintenance of the fields and facilities in the Canada Bay Area.

Here's to hoping 2021 is another successful season for the Sports at Briars Sports!

Gerard Price OAM | 30/11/1963 - 13/12/2020



Briars lost one of its finest ever with our Cricket Chairman for the past 31 years, Gerard Price, passing-away in December 2020.

Gerard was a truly remarkable person and an exceptional Briar.

Gerard's dedicated contribution to his beloved sport of cricket, both on and off the field, will have him remembered as one of Briars Sports favourite sons. His untiring devotion to Briars Cricket over 40 years was immeasurable. He was revered by all cricketers and leaves a legacy and culture within cricket that will endure over time.

Gerard commenced playing as a 16-year-old in 1980 winning the comp in C-

Grade in that first year playing with his younger brother Paul. He was described in that year's annual report as "the find of the season". The following year in 81/82 he went direct to A grade where he was described as "having a good future in cricket in the club" and then spent the next 20 years or so in first grade. Early on he quickly became an integral part of Briars Cricket, with the club becoming his home away from home, especially in summer. He also played Hockey for the club in first grade for many seasons during winter.

In 1989 Gerard took over as cricket chairman and continued in that role ever since. As a player he won many premierships, including at least one in every grade and was a competitive player in 4th grade till last season. One of his proudest moments came a few years back when he played his first game with his son Damian for Briars. Gerard achieved many records both as player and administrator. It was through his determination that Gerard turned Briars Cricket into the most successful cricket club in the shire's competition, with record breaking club championships and premierships during his time as Chairman as follows:

• Club Championships - 18 including a current record-breaking run of 8 consecutive years

- 1st Grade 6 Premierships
- 2nd Grade 10 Premierships
- 3rd Grade 10 Premierships
- 4th grade 10 Premiership
- Under 24s 3 Premierships

However, Gerard's success will never be judged on premierships alone. More importantly was his ability to offer a stable, well administered, and well-respected sport allowing many juniors and seniors the opportunity to play cricket. It was Gerard's unique ability to create such a culture within cricket that provided an environment that allowed cricket to grow and flourish under his watch.

The lifeblood of Briars Sports is in the effort of those volunteers willing to put their hand up and make a difference and Gerard epitomised what this stands for. As both chairman and a player he led by example but remained humble. Through his efforts as chairman for over 30 years Gerard was a true representation of what amateur sport is all about, and was a shining example within Briars, and the wider cricket community through his work with Cricket NSW.

Over the years Gerard had also achieved the following across a 40-year playing career.

7453 runs at 23.9 from 467 innings including 155 not outs, 1168 wickets (most ever for Briars) from 6479 overs at 13.2 and 316 catches whilst wearing the Briars cap. He also won 8 premierships as a player across the 4 grades:

Gerard also achieved the following:

- 2009 Granted life membership of Briars Sports
- 2012 Awarded City of Canada Bay Sport Citizen of the year
- 2012 The Gerard Price Cricket Trophy for the Briars Junior Cricketer of the year was inaugurated.
- 2013 Admitted to Shires Cricket Hall of Fame

2 significant fundraising bike rides with a group of friends, firstly from Sydney to Melbourne in 2016, then the following year from Melbourne to Adelaide raising in excess of \$70,000 for the Unicorn Foundation.

2020 Order of Australia Medal in recognition for services to cricket and the community

For all those who knew Gerard, the success of Cricket was due to his strength of character. He was the first person to contact and greet you when you first started playing at the club and he always made you feel welcome either from day 1 or year 15. He also made sure you did not lose contact with Briars once you stopped playing.

Gerard had the personality that was welcoming and engaging, the drive and motivation to make sure that the job got done and without fuss. He had the spirit, respect, integrity and determination required to be the leader that he was. All these characteristics came together to make him the person we all admired, loved, and will now miss so much.

Our thoughts remain with Jane and children Damian, Bethany and Erin and the wider Price family of his parents Kevin and Moreen and siblings John, Paul, Jenny and Joanne.

Briars Cricket will not be the same without him. There will only ever be one Gerard Price.

May he Rest in Peace.

## Keith Free OAM | 24/03/1929 - 31/12/2020

Keith started playing bowls in 1962 at the National Coursing Bowling Club at Moxham Road Punchbowl. Keith's bowling successes commenced in 1963, when he won the minor singles and then runner-up in the major singles the following year. He also won the pairs and fours before transferring to Greenlees Park in 1965.



When Keith moved to Concord, he joined Greenlees Park Bowling Club. During his bowling career at Greenlees Park, he won no less than 7 major singles, 10 major pairs, including the triples for 7 consecutive years from 1970 to 1976 & the club fours 9 times and mixed pairs twice.

Keith's best performance was in the prestigious Capita Singles in 1990. This event drew 10,000 entries from all over Australia. 10 NSW players made it through to the last 32 in the country and Keith Free was one of these players. Keith's luck in this event ran out when the umpire was called to adjudicate on the last bowl of the last end and unfortunately awarded the shot to his opponent.

Other victories include:

- He was a team member of 15 winning pennant sides of which 9 of have been in 1<sup>st</sup> grade.
- James Hall triples in 1970, 89, 91 and 92
- The St George Strudwick open fours in 1974
- The Petersham open triples in 1975, and the Ryde City fours in 1997.

In the year 2000, the Board of Directors at Greenlees Park Bowling Club honoured Keith by introducing and naming a prestigious bowls tournament and naming it "The Keith Free Pairs" which was held for 5 consecutive years.

The most prominent highlight of Keith's career was in 2003 when Keith was awarded the Order of Australia medal for his services to the racing industry, and to community services in general.

In 2006, Keith was nominated and invested with the distinctive honour of Patron of the Men's Bowling Club. In recognition of Keith's achievements and commitment to the Bowling Club, he was awarded Life Membership. Added to Life Membership, the most recent event in his illustrious bowling career was the naming of our number 2 green the "Keith Free OAM Green" the showpiece of our club. This is the pinnacle reward members can bestow upon an individual.

At the AGM in the first year of our amalgamation with Briars, Keith was nominated and invested as a copatron of Briars at Greenlees Ltd along with David Walker from the former Briars club.

## Peter Herbert Walker | 21/2/1941 - 21/08/2020



Peter, son of Don Walker (Briars Kentwell Cup 1930's and 1940's) and Gwen Walker, passed away at 7:30am on Friday August 21<sup>st</sup> after several years of gradually worsening illness.

Peter completed his leaving certificate at Sydney Grammar School in November 1957 and the following week completed his Briars Membership Application at 30a George St. Burwood, proposed by his father Don and seconded by Ted Stockdale who had been close to the family for decades.

In 1958 Peter commenced a degree in Chemical Engineering at the University of NSW. He also commenced employment at CSR thanks to an introduction arranged by Bob Clark and in March commenced playing Rugby with Briars. He played Rugby with Briars from 1958 – 1962 and then, on completion of his university degree, CSR moved him to

Melbourne where he flatted with various Briars including Brian Ray and eventual Briars President, Ian Richard.

In 1969 Peter re-located back to Sydney. By now CSR had merged with Dow Chemicals and Peter continued in Sydney in executive roles with Dow. During 1969, after moving to Sydney, he met, at Cremorne Point where he was residing, his future wife Libby. They were married in 1970.

Peter and Libby were moved by Dow Chemicals to Midland, their head office in Michigan USA, where he worked from 1971 - 1973 and then, again with Dow, re-located to Hong Kong in 1974 as an Executive

Director. Catching up with Peter in Hong Kong became a rite of passage for many Briars over these years during visits to the Hong Kong Sevens.

In 1984, Peter and Libby, still with Dow Chemicals returned to Sydney, now with children, Simone, Richard and Peta and purchased a home in Wahroonga. Peter continued with Dow Chemicals but in 1987 commenced employment with ICI who in following years became Orica and in this role, while still residing in Sydney, made over 40 visits to South Africa for Orica and eventually his own corporate activities.

In 2006 Peter retired from Orica but continued with his own South African businesses. In following years Peter and Libby relocated to Sydney's Northern Beaches purchasing an apartment in Newport. Over the last several years Peter's health gradually declined to a point where he was eventually admitted to a care facility to which Libby has been a daily visitor for the latter few years.

Peter is survived by his wife Libby, his daughters Simone and Peta and families who reside in Victoria and son, Richard who lives with his family in Sydney. Peter's 2 brothers David and Chris, who both played Rugby with Briars are also still with us.

## John Mortlock | 31/03/2020



John Mortlock passed away on Tuesday, 31<sup>st</sup> March 1920 after suffering from lung and heart issues. John is survived by his wife Trish and children, Jeremy, Stirling, Lincoln, Stewart and Camille.

John Mortlock joined Briars in 1961, along with Jim Barret, Lin Dytor, John Edmonds & Dave Lindsay. All except J.V.B. have left us.

Mort arrived at Briars from The Kings School, which he attended for 7 years as a boarder. His brother Will also boarded at Kings going on to play rugby for East's and Colleagues. Mort and Trish's four sons, Jeremy, Stirling, Lincoln and Stewart subsequently boarded at King's, between them they

played over 800 games for Gordon. Stirling also captained the Brumbies, Rebels and Wallabies.

In Mort's first year he played Burke Cup and his coach, Cliff Dodds wrote in the '61 Annual Report; "John Mortlock: (Winger) Outstanding winger of Briars. Ran with determination, speed and like a drunken pheasant to score many a sensational try."

**In 1962** Mort made Kentwell. His coach, Brian Williams, wrote in his end of season annual commentary; "A most evasive runner and very safe tackler, a good turnoff speed when he runs straight but John does tend to run into the cover defence once he has beaten his man – needs to use the full width of the field more. Very keen and incredibly determined at all times when in possession."

Mort also struck an arrangement with the Bath Arms Hotel that he and several Briars teammates could arrive at 9:58pm straight from Goddard Park and order 2 rounds each for consumption by 10:30pm. This became a multi-year arrangement managed and overseen by Mort.

In 1963, another Kentwell year, coach Brian Williams wrote, "Scored many tries with hard evasive running.

Defence also very sound. Could afford to make extra man more often."

Mort also made the Combined Sub-District team for the first time. He became a fixture on the right wing for the next few years. Fellow '64 Invincibles, Gus Ahern and Jack Burkhart, both from Trinity, also arrived at Briars in 1963.

**In 1964** Mort with 16 other team members became the 1964 Kentwell Premiers after an unbeaten season. A first for Briars. Kentwell and Burk teams were Minor Premiers and Briars were Club Champions. Coach Brian Williams wrote of Mort: *"Ability is well known and because of this, had to contend with excessive* 



defence. Despite this, made many rousing runs and scored his share of tries. Opposing wings found his defence too strong."

In 1965 Mort was a member of the second Briars Rugby tour of New Zealand.

The touring team included 9 '64 Invincibles plus 2 ex-Briars returning from Shute Shield who became members of the 1965 Kentwell Premiership side.

**In 1965** Briars were successful in winning another Minor Premiership and Kentwell Premiership. Mort was not a regular in '65 but did play both in the Kentwell and Burke games throughout the season.

**In 1966** Briars were beaten by Colleagues in a final. Mort was back to his best in Kentwell Cup and combined Sub-District.

**In 1967** Mort played both Kentwell and Burke Cup. He appeared in the burke Cup Grand Final as an outside centre.

**In 1968** Mort started playing squash for Briars and continued for many years particularly with his '64 and '65 rugby mate, John McNicol.

**In 1971** Mort married Patricia who was a lawyer. And started his own business "J.G. Mortlock Insurances Pty Limited" in 1976. Half of the rugby team was insured by Mort over the next many years until he sold the business in 2008.

**In 1978** Mort with his '65 Kentwell Premier mate, Richard Crookes, followed prior Briars players, Chris Walker, Mike Mathews and David Walker by coaching St. Ives at Hassall Park. The Briars – St. Ives link was founded on the Briars decade of coaching of St. Ives in the 70's.

Mort was and remains a Briars Rugby legend.

## Ray 'Tiger' Coombes



The sad passing of 'Tiger' in 2020 after a long struggle with illness will be mourned by all members of Greenlees Park Men's Bowling Club.

Ray was an integral part of the bowling fraternity both at a social and competitive level having represented the club at Pennants and Zone competitions across a number of years. He Bowled with distinction for several other clubs as well prior to joining Greenlees.

Apart from being a valued bowler, Ray was an exceptional person whose warmth and good humour were recognised and valued by all who dealt with

him. In his honour, a Memorial Day was held to recognise his passing and contribution to the Club.

Club Championship-WINNERS (8th Year in a row) Well, what a season that was even though we did not get to finish it! The outbreak of Covid 19 has disrupted the way we live and obviously the sport we can and can't play and unfortunately our season was cut short when there was a real possibility of multiple Premierships. To this end we are grateful to the many former players who help out when needed to fill a gap somewhere and this is one major reason that we are

This season proved to be a remarkably interesting season in that we again fielded 4 x 5<sup>th</sup> grade teams for the fifth time. This consisted of our usual Maroon and Gold teams as well as teams called Briars Rivals and Briars Brothers. These guys play the game that we want them to play and are a welcome addition to our Club. Unfortunately, the 5<sup>th</sup> grade competition has become stronger each year as other Clubs look to bring in standalone teams to try and win competitions rather than use this competition as a development grade for new and younger players.

We never take our success for granted as it is so difficult to win but we certainly crave that winning feeling as a Club.

We know all other Clubs try to match or copy us and they are all incredibly determined to beat us. We take that as a compliment and a challenge that we are used to now and know that it will take an extraordinarily strong and dedicated Club to beat us.

The First Graders again acquitted themselves very superbly finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> before the semis where they played Warringah. Bowling first we absolutely demoralized the dismissing them for only 54 with Steve Davis (5-21) and Jack Kovacic (3-4) doing the damage. This proved to be our last game before Covid ended the season. Another fantastic effort by Max Squire and the lads.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> graders were outstanding. issues, Paul Price for his regular 'advice' and feedback on all issues and regular updates each Saturday of the Briars Facebook page, Terry Murphy for his representation of the Club at the various SCA meetings in town each month and for providing any statistics on past players when requested on occasions, and Jason Harris and Richard Tregeagle who helped manage the Under 24's. Apologies to anyone I have failed to mention but your efforts are much appreciated.

This season was a difficult one for other reasons besides Covid-19 with plenty of rain and then the heartbreaking bushfires. At late notice we were able to join forces with Randwick Petersham CC to play a 20/20 Fundraiser for one of our former players family being Doug Loth. In a great show of spirit over \$7000 was raised in one day to assist Der Loth who had lost everything in the frightening bushfires that raged through the South Coast town of Cobargo. It was a great day and much appreciated by the Loth family.

For the last decade or so we have been extremely fortunate to be associated with a wonderful company called **VENUS PACKAGING** who have provided us with valuable financial support during this period. Their involvement with our Club has coincided with the incredible success our cricketers have enjoyed, and I believe their association with us has helped us concentrate on our cricket and ensure sensational results. Once again, the length of pre-season training gives every player plenty of time to shake the cobwebs off and get a running start heading into the upcoming season. We had plenty of Briars juniors attend with the opportunity to train and play in the seniors, which is a great sign for the future. There were many talented players, quite a few that probably need another season or two to really get on their feet in the seniors, but a few players caught my eye with the chance to play for Briars Gold during the season. But with the depth of players available it was hard to fit to many of these players into the already available squads. With selections for the first match looming, it looked to be a similar line up to the previous season, still quite a young side with a couple older players in there, but quite an inexperienced Briars squad it was. But it was the grade to give younger players the opportunity to get their foot in the door to senior's cricket, and the chance to give one particular new kid a spot in our team was exciting, not only for him, but myself too.

During a pre-season training session at the 360° Cricket Academy in Mortlake, I was standing outside the net behind the bowlers getting an idea of all the new players and watched this tall, lanky boy rolling his arm over. He kept a straight seam and his line and length were rather good. I asked him to alter is line and length a few times to different batsmen and although it was not perfect, for a 16year-old he had good control and I knew I had something here. This young boy's name was Jack Benchoam and I was adamant to have him in my team. His selection got a thumbs up from head selector Gerard and the other captains but drew criticism from some players in my team who did not think much of his bowling or my selection choice. These 'opinions' were quickly retracted by a few of them after his performances in the first few matches, and one who still hasn't apologised for his opinion. But I will let that slide.

This season, my Vice-Captain was Harry Lee, who I did not really make official until Round 8 against Ryde - Hunters Hill while during a drink break. His insight into each game, ideas and opinions in bowling and fielding changes helped me make my job easier. Cameron Durrant, our keeper also helped for most of the season. He is one of the highest capped Briars Gold players so his leadership in the team was respected, as well as his blow ups behind the stumps. Both players also captained the team during the season while I was unavailable for a couple matches with Harry

being 1 from 1 and Cameron 1 from 2 in their respective Captaincies. I taught them well. Over the past couple seasons, we have had a few players altering their role in the team to be a better fit. People such as Michael Gordon swapping from leg spinner to pace bowler last season, which was more suited to his aggression.

This season, with the continuous lack of opening bats in the lower grades, Ritesh Desai put his hand up to take the opportunity and hopefully after this season continues to improve and show aggressiveness and positivity at the top of the order. After flirting with the idea late in the 18/19 season, Biplav Dutta became the team's off spinner with his right arm darts. Taking 17 wickets for the season, he was pivotal in getting important wickets with his change of pace. I, myself, also changed my bowling. Swapping from left arm

meds to off-spin halfway through the season, it was an advantage to have another spinner with plenty of pace bowlers in the team. Also helps to get through the overs a bit quicker if needed.

Our season was another mixed one finishing a clear 6<sup>th</sup> with 9 wins from 22 rounds. Heading into Christmas and heading into finals were our strongest periods with a couple back-to-back wins but the rest of the season we continued to be inconsistent with our success. Personal glimpses of brilliance were shown right throughout the season, unfortunately just not enough of it. The best bowling figures came from a tandem effort in the same match with Jack Benchoam (4/14) & Colin Taylor (4/15) demolishing Mount Pritchard-Southern Districts Gold out at Greenway. His 71 at Mona 3 was all over in a matter of 12 overs disposing the ball all over and swung the match in our favour early into the match. Hopefully, he will return and make an impact in the higher grades.



Even though we were not able to gain the success we should be attaining, the team is a close group. We have a group chat involving everyone, and even a Briars Gold awards night with around 15 players attending over ZOOM was a success and a lot of fun. I try to push positive reinforcement into my team, and when we stay positive the results will follow. There is no use talking down to your players, everyone can learn from their mistakes. But in a tough competition where most teams are full of mature players, we try to stand tall and show what we have got. It builds our character for the future. We will continue to get stronger.

I want to thank all the other captains, Max Squire, Brad Sculley, Paul Simpson, Lloyd Andrews, Brett Howle and Anthony Clarke for another fantastic season. Selections is the toughest component of being a captain, as we deal with fortnightly and weekly changes (especially in the lower grades!) but somehow, we manage to get the full complement of teams every round. The top four grades DOMINATED their Qualifying Finals matches and for all of it to come to nothing due to the early adjournment of the season was a real shame. I hope it means we are all hoping for retribution this upcoming season.

I also want to thank Gerard, for all the support and opinions he has given us and the captains throughout the season. The continuous work he does for this club, day in and day out, we are all grateful for the effort he puts in. Looking forward to another, hopefully uninterrupted, successful season!



#### What does 2021 involve?

The current state of the national and state bodies does not directly affect us. The changes to the Sydney Rugby Union structure may do so. For us to succeed we need to get better at how we administer and improve on how we play the game. Our goal is to return to Kentwell Cup, and it does take on average about 10 years to achieve. Petersham RUFC are the prime example of this timeline. Succeeding is also about setting manageable goals and working hard to achieve them. Currently Briars Rugby has the correct foundations. We have the following in place for achieving that Kentwell Cup aspiration sooner rather than later:

- Improved playing and training facilities
- Good base fitness and skill levels
- Experienced coaches for 2021
- Funding for the next 5 years from Briars Sports (with conditions)
- A Colts Program
- U14s Juniors who will progress to Colts in 5 years' time
- Player & Coach Pathway with the appointment of Ex Rugby Australia High Performance Coach Hugh Carpenter
- Adoption of Player Injury Protocols developed by West Harbour
- Player Mentor & Recruitment Program
- New Old Boys prepared to be involved.

Many are aware that I have been communicating with West Harbour and they have been more than helpful with direction we require to get to Division One. I would like to see Briars get behind West Harbour and help support them through their rebuilding phase as we have been enduring the same for the past four seasons. It's been talked about for a long time that our two clubs should work together. Season 2021 could be a season where we can work collaboratively and move forward together. Both clubs want success, and we can restore the pathway where Briars played for West Harbour as a representative achievement in a player's career.

To lead you into Season 2021 a dynamic team of committee people and coaches will be led by your new Chairman Mark Nelson. I am proudly taking up the role of Vice Chairman and working alongside Mark and his committee to ensure we keep growing and build on our success. I look forward to seeing you all at a game next year.

Our first challenge with Covid was trying to get our older statesmen and committee members up to speed with technology (not an easy task), for those all important weekly catch ups over zoom. Training without contact, no use of equipment, daily registration of players attendance, covid testing and having to wash our balls constantly was just some of the new normal we had to deal with when being allowed to start up again. I think one of the hardest parts was keeping the players motivated for a possible season with out knowing how it would look, when it would start, just trying to keep the players mentally ready for what could unfold and upbeat about the unknown.

The one thing that had not changed was a committee that will do whatever it takes for the betterment of the club and the boys who represent the jersey every Saturday and ultimately played a massive part in us having any form of season.

Eight weeks passed after lifting the Walker Cup and what came out of hibernation was a group a players who took it upon themselves to train, keep fit and work hard in isolation, we kept the hunger, the GAS and flew into our shortened and restricted final off season sessions before heading into 10 weekends of rugby almost back to back.

We lifted more than ever as a club and that was not only evident off the field but on the field. The results this season do all talking for us, our goal was always to make a challenge of every game, keep the score lines respectful and not finish last.

Going into the final two rounds all teams had everything to play for to finish top four and qualify for the final's series. But it all came down to the final weekend, as we took a clean sweep on old rivals Sydney Harlequins. With this securing top four for both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2nd grade and top four for the club overall.

The season will be remembered for those games that built character, 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Vs. Newport; 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Vs. Harlequins; 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Vs. Blacktown and Colts Vs. Blacktown. If you told me, we would finish top four in Div 3 I would have said you are dreaming.

# Briars 1<sup>st</sup> Grade

I said to Johnny Slender and the coaches that we will treat the reduced 7 round competition as a trial season as I wanted to see new players and build on the skills of the players. Although we were still short in a few key positions some former Wests boys and Rugby League fellas came down to join us and quickly fitted in.

Round 1 was at the foot of the mountains against Hawkesbury Ag. It was obvious a lot of their players had come across from league. It was a messy day, but we manage to come away with a 24-3 win. Second round we played Blacktown at St Luke's. In a game where Blacktown were not strong across the grades and they played with guts against 1<sup>st</sup> Grade. Some of their players had doubled up and we only managed 18-7 against them. It was obvious that some on-field decision making had to improve. Round 3 we played Iggies at Ryde Park. This was a game where we could bash them with our forward pack all game and hurt them. However, with 2 mins to go, we kick the ball back to them and they run the length of the field to beat us 22-20. That day it struck a few guys that possession is crucial. We moved onto Headen Park, home of Beacroft for Round 4 and it was a muddy paddock. Only a few games were played that weekend and one was ours. Possession went against us again which showed on the scoreboard. That day the forwards kept it tight and the scrums showed we could muscle up against the clubs in Div 3. Although it was a loss the boys were learning and growing as a team. I think they started to listen a bit as well. Score was 18-5 to Beecroft.

Round 5 we got beaten by Newport who went on to win the Club Championship and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade premiership. The result was 17-49 at St Lukes. It did not help us that we had 3 players in the bin at the same time. John and I spoke about the game afterwards and it were evident that Briars had carried over some luggage from Division 4 and that was not being able to technically compete at the breakdown with speed without infringing. The penalty count was high against the entire club and 60% were ruck infringements. Hugh Carpenter and David Munnoch kindly came down and assisted us with a few sessions so we could clean up our penalties. This paid off well. Hugh brought his technical expertise and delivered sessions to the boys on the skills required to be effective. David Munnoch adjudicated with his referee's whistle so the boys would know what the wrong way and right way was to go about play at the breakdown. Round 6 we played Hawkesbury Valley and we managed a victory 43-32. We experimented with the backline that day and the changes made a difference. Our final round match for the shortened season was the grand final replay with Harlequins taking on Briars at Waterloo Oval. We beat them 19-41. However, we controlled the game for about 40% of the match. This earnt a place in the semis which were sudden death. We were up against Newport again and winner went straight through to the Grand final. Preparation that week was good with Wests letting our forwards train with them. We had nothing to lose and the experience more to gain. We met Newport at Sefton Oval and we had them in a panic. - A full Committee already being appointed for next year, with several new and fabulous people sticking up their hand to help out, even in roles we have never had before. I never cease to be amazed at the the spectrum of talent we have within the members of our club.
- Re-establishment of the Briars Academy, a specialised training group for our top Juniors players. Cindy Goodridge was instrumental in driving the re-start, with super-coach Alan Charlton delivering the goods on the field.
- The continued success of our Juniors programme, with virtually all teams making the finals series, and several appearances in Grand Finals, including the top-level U15 and U17 Metro competitions. It was a great testament to all of the people involved in supporting our Junior programme.
- The support we have received from the Briars Club and Board, to help drive even greater success for hockey in the coming years.

Some special thanks are in order, although I could never hope to thank everyone who helped out in such a difficult year.

- Our 2020 Committee, and in particular our Secretary Nicola Skinner and Treasurer Harriet Ashton-Maxwell. The normal workload for these roles is heavy every year, however this year has probably seen about triple the normal load with effectively three seasons being organised. The work involved in communications, setting and re-setting fees, organising refunds for partial seasons and so on, has been nothing short of Herculean. The club owes a great deal of gratitude to Nic and Harriet in particular.
- To the people leaving the Committee, or who are taking on new roles.
- To all of our coaches and managers- with a particular shout-out to Alan Charlton, who took on the coaching of four teams this year, including our Mens 1<sup>st</sup> Grade, and a shared role in our Womens 1<sup>st</sup> Grade.

- To our umpires and volunteers, and to Chris Thuell and Kylie Norris respectively for taking such important lead roles for the club in these areas.
- To our club sponsors- Mortgage Choice Concord for supporting us for nine consecutive years, and for Gary Bieser taking to the field as our 6<sup>th</sup> Grade goalie for his first season in the pads. All goalies must be genuinely mad. Also, thanks to our new sponsor, Flamingo Gas.
- To everyone at the Briars Sports Club and Board that have worked so tirelessly and professionally to keep the club successful in this most difficult of years, so that they can continue to support each of the sports. They should be recognised for their incredible, quiet effort that not many people get to see.
- And again, to everyone who just coped with life, and managed to get on to the pitch this year, to take their part in continuing the great story and tradition that is Briars Hockey.

Hopefully 2021 will be a year of fewer stresses for everyone, and I look forward to helping our great club and all of its people achieve even greater success, but more importantly to get the maximum enjoyment possible out of the season for both themselves and their families.

## The Ted Stockdale Trophy

#### Awarded to Matina Moffitt

Matina currently holds positions on multiple NSW Junior Cricket Associations in addition to representing Briars Junior Cricket at an Association level. Junior Cricket at Briars has benefited enormously from Matina's broader involvement and boasts one of the largest and most successful Junior Cricket clubs in NSW.

#### DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE REPORTS

#### General

This Summary of the Financial Statements has been derived from the full financial report of Briars at Greenlees Limited [Briars] for the year ended 30 September 2020. The discussion and analysis is based on those financial reports and is provided to assist members in the understanding of the financial statements.

A copy of the full financial report and audit report thereon will be made available to any member upon request to the General Manager.

#### Statement of Profit/(Loss) and Other Comprehensive Income

Briars total revenue of \$4,528,222 has decreased by \$275,734 (5.74%) compared to last year [\$4,803,956], and operating expenses excluding depreciation, amortisation and finance costs of \$3,503,203 has also decreased by \$586,216 (14.33%) from last year [\$4,089,419], resulting in net profit before tax of \$488,994 [income tax: \$ Nil] compared to a 2019 profit of \$353,214 [income tax: \$ Nil].

Individual items and trading conditions that have impacted the 2020 result include:

- The Club was closed due to covid-19 from 23 March 2020 through to 31 May 2020, re-opening on 1 June 2020.
- Government assistance and support was provided in the form of:
  - Commonwealth: JobKeeper employee payroll support \$198.000 0 A further \$36,000 was received from the government in October, 2020. Commonwealth: Cash flow boost for employers \$100.000 0 State: Grants supporting operating expenses \$13,000 0
  - Local: Lease abatement [Cintra; Club Car Park] 0
  - \$34,474 Total \$345,474 0
- Poker machine taxes and other expenses increased by \$21,483 (5.99%).
- Entertainment, marketing and promotion expenses decreased by \$18,613 (5.47%) during the period the Club was closed
- Depreciation and amortisation expense increased significantly by \$148,949 [43.39%):
  - Following a change in the accounting standard for leases [AASB 16] the accounting treatment for "operating" 0 leases has materially changed. The accounting of leased "Right-of-Use" assets now generates a depreciation charge. Please refer to Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies in the full Financial Report.
    - Depreciation charge [owned assets] 2020 \$367,769 2019 \$343,280 + \$24,489 (7.13%)
    - Depreciation charge [Right-of-Use assets] 2020 \$119,506
    - Amortisation expense [Website development] 2020 \$4,954 .
- Employee benefit expenses decreased significantly by \$232,169 (28.18%):
  - Wages were subsidised by the government JobKeeper payments [see above]; and 0
  - Permanent employees taking annual leave during the period the Club was closed. 0
- Other expenses from ordinary activities decreased by \$278,750 (13.45%) during the period the Club was closed.
- Bar sales were down to \$1,051,125 compared to last year of \$1,297,289. A decrease of \$246,164 (18.98%):
  - Directly attributable to the Club's closure on 23 March 2020 through to re-opening on 1 June 2020. 0
  - The gross profit percentage decreased from 62.01% to 60.65%. 0
- There was a small decrease in poker machine net clearances of \$4,635, largely due to the surge in poker machine participation following the Club re-opening on 1 June 2020.

#### Statement of financial position

Briars net assets have increased by \$488,994 or 8.82% since last year. This change consisted of:

- An increase in total assets of \$2,538,826; and
- An increase in total liabilities of \$2.049.832.

#### DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE REPORTS [CONTINUED]

#### Statement of financial position [continued]

The increase in net assets for the year is mainly attributable to:

- Increase in property, plant and equipment of \$2,116,243 following changes to the revised accounting treatment for operating leases [Right-of-use assets];
- Net Increase in property, plant and equipment of \$126,738 comprising renovations to the clubhouse, furniture and equipment, and new poker machines;
- Net increase in intangible assets of \$131,545 following the purchase of gaming machine entitlements;
- Increase in cash and cash equivalents of \$227,357;
- Net increase in financial liabilities of \$2,019,665 following changes to the revised accounting treatment for operating leases [Lease Liabilities].

#### Statement of cash flows

Operating activities provided net cash inflows of \$952,271, compared to \$914,459 last year.

Net cash used by investing activities of \$629,993 mainly related to the payment for property, plant and equipment and the purchase of gaming machine entitlements.

Net cash used by financing activities of \$94,921 is for the lease payments to lessors. This relates to the new accounting treatment for operating leases.

Cash at year end of the year was \$618,070 compared to \$390,712 last year.
