

## Chairman's Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to present to members the 18<sup>th</sup> Briars Sports Annual Report for the year ending 30 September 2023.

The past year has been a remarkable period in our club's history marked by significant achievements, both on and off the field. Our sporting fields witnessed exceptional participation for cricket, rugby, hockey, squash, bowls, and netball, which was complimented with record patronage and club turnover.

Briars Sports' continues its commitment with its aim to be the sporting club of choice within our community by providing well administered and well-respected sports. We wish to provide seniors and juniors, men and women, boys, and girls the opportunity to play amateur sport at any level and have an

enjoyable experience whilst doing so. As a local community club our focus is on continually enhancing our club premises for our members, their guests, and visitors.

I am pleased to report that over the past 12 months Briars Sports has been successful on both fronts.

Financially, the club reported a profit of \$297,714 (2022 \$490,884). This includes significant one-off expenses that were incurred during the year, thus affecting the result when compared to the prior year. A truer reflection of the club's performance rests in our EBITDA results of \$1,166,820 (2022 \$1,166,831). We are aware of the current cost of living challenges faced by our members and would like this opportunity to thank our members, their guests, and visitors for their patronage over the past 12 months. Please refer to Matina Moffit's Treasurer's report for great commentary on our financial results.

As a result of the Club's strong performance, the Board was once again happy to support all sports under the Briars and Greenlees Park banners. The total contribution to our sports was \$115,900 and this funding will be used to help with all costs associated with the running of those sports to ensure that they will be able to serve the community from a solid base.

The community funding does not stop with our own sports. The Club contributed \$55,900 to local groups through the Club Grants category 1 and non-Club Grants funding. Further information on individual group funding can be found on page 6 of this annual report.

In early 2023 the expansion of our new gaming room was opened and has been well received by patrons. Other improvements included the ongoing display of our memorabilia around the club, the highlight being the return of the refurbished rostrum within club premises for the benefit of our sports with their post-match day celebrations. 10 Additional external tables were also installed on the playing green to cope with additional demand. Overall, our clubrooms present contemporary and functional spaces for the benefit of members and guests.

Our sporting achievements over the last 12 months have been notable with our playing numbers and results remaining very pleasing. Senior cricket won their 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive club championship. Junior cricket continues to perform strongly, especially with girls' cricket growing with ever increasing numbers. Senior Rugby continue to strive for consistent performances and need to benefit from this year's experiences to make next season better. Junior Rugby performed well notwithstanding the challenges of their sport at a national level. Hockey continues to strive to be one of the top clubs with Sydney and are working hard towards this goal. Squash remains relevant and strong with their refurbished new facilities at Thornleigh proving popular. Our Netball teams remain one of the largest clubs within the Inner West Comp with several

premierships and strong on-field performances over a large range of ages. Importantly Men's and Ladies bowls have had another fruitful year being well patronised and enjoyed by all participants.

Briars Sport is well led by our General Manager Jason Parle. Jason joined us some 6 years ago and the results of his leadership and enthusiasm over these years are evident in how the club has evolved and significantly improved during this time. Jason is well supported by his senior team of Jacinta, Monique, Ben. On behalf of our members my sincere thanks to all our staff for their efforts during the year.

Changes in leadership for some of our sports have occurred over the last 12 months. Anthony Clarke (senior cricket) was replaced by Damian Price, Kate Campbell (Netball) was replaced by Bindi March-Ali, David Slater (Hockey) and Keiron Devlin (Junior Cricket) have also stood down with their replacements to be confirmed. It is obvious that the success of all our sports rests with the leadership, time and effort put in by our respective sporting chairpersons. I wish to express my gratitude to those departing chairs and thank them for a job well done. I also appreciate the commitment of the remaining sport chairs and their committees for the enormous amount of time they dedicate towards their sport. As an amateur sporting club with some 2,000 participants, we rely on the multitude of volunteers to run our sports. At the top of the pile is chairperson and their committee right down to the coaches and managers to make sure we get a competitive team on the field each week. Each year the challenges seem to get greater in terms of running our sports for participation numbers, sourcing income, or keeping costs under control, however all our sports should be proud of their recent achievements.

My thanks also to all the sponsors of all our sports who play an important role in keeping our sports viable. I would also like to acknowledge and thank Canada Bay Council for their pivotal role and assistance during the year. Briars Sports is probably one of the largest users of the council's grounds and facilities and we are grateful for their support and that of the individual council officers that our sports deal with.

During the year Richard Davies took over as operator of The Backyard, being our bistro. Richard and his team have been a welcome addition and have brought some refreshing enhancements to our bistro and food offerings. His hard work since commencing has been evident and we wish him every future success.

My condolences to the families of those club members that passed away during the year. The club especially notes the passing of Ian Steele, Warren Bryan, Robert "Bob" Buchanan, Colin Jones & Mike Mathews.

Finally, my thanks to our Board of directors for their efforts and contributions during the year. The Board can be well pleased with the results of the last 12 months; however, the challenge always remains how we can strive to make the year ahead better than the one before. The Board is always planning for the future and addressing issues for where the club and our sports will be in 5 or 10-years' time. That said, the Board is well balanced in terms of both sport representation and business acumen, which provides a solid foundation for our future performance.

Finally, I would like to thank all our members and sporting players for their contributions over the last year. My sincere appreciation for your patronage and / or participation on the sporting field. I look forward to that continuing in the year ahead and seeing you on the sporting field or around the club sometime.

## Treasurer's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's report for the year ended 30 September 2023.

The profit for the year was \$297,714 compared to the prior year result of \$490,884.

This was a big year of renovations both for the club premises and the remediation works performed on our investment property held at George Street, Burwood. These major renovations resulted in a business loan of \$631,699 as at year end. Our objective is to continue to invest to ensure we remain relevant to our members, and they can enjoy their time at the club.

In addition, the 2023 financial year profit does not include the profits made by the sports, which amounted to \$202,811. These amounts are carried forward to the financial year ending September 2024 to assist the sports with their upcoming seasons.

I would like to acknowledge our club members for their continued support. Also, a big thank you to all the volunteers who worked tiredly to ensure that the sports were able to take the field. I am sure most are keen to have an uninterrupted season.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Jason Parle, our General Manager, the Briars management team Ben, Jacinta, Monique, and my fellow directors for their huge contribution throughout the year that has seen the club perform well.

Always the gentleman, polite and thoughtful, lan would often apologise to any women present at the beginning of the night for any bad language or inappropriate behaviour that may ensue.


At one stage Steelie worked for a bank located across the road from the Club. Probably not great news for either the bank or the club. At this time many members cashed cheques at the club. Ian took this to a new level by borrowing anyone's cheque, madly scribbling in numbers, and crossing out others so he could access cash from his account. Amazingly this was all OK and the cheques were always accepted.

Steelie saved his best performances for tours. In the 1978 USA Rugby tour report he vied for the 'most scores' award only to be pipped by one of the other tourists. Ian had to be satisfied with 'most consistent' award on tour.

He was a caring character, who would regularly keep in touch, regardless of the time or circumstances. His kindness and care were something that all his friends can attest. If there was illness, tough times or you just needed a hand, he was always there for you.

He also noted that 'Warren's speed in the open was only matched by his ability as a goal kicker." Anyone who knew Warren, knows that he wasn't quick.... so did he miss the goal opportunity he gave himself ...we will never know!

Work moved Warren and his family away from Sydney, however he always kept in contact with the club.

Warren always had a joke and told them extremely well. He contributed to the club's Focus newsletter for many years. When living in Mollymook as 'The Mouth from the South' and when he moved to Queensland 'The Noise from the North'.

Warren was a Rugby League Referee, in New Guinea, NSW and Qld. He was a passionate Western Suburbs Magpies supporter and later a Wests Tigers fan. Bob and I also delved into small electrical projects within our local community, a testament to his diverse skill set and willingness to lend a hand wherever needed.


Some of our fondest memories were made out on Bob's boat, the Garth, as we zipped up and down the Parramatta River, sharing laughter and creating unforgettable moments.

The U24 Frank Gray Shield has been an elusive prize for Briars, with many of our teams coming close to winning a premiership over the last two decades. With a strong preseason behind us, we went into round one confident that we would be able to put out a strong showing against Auburn. However, a lacklustre batting performance left us defending a meagre 85. In true Briars' spirit, we felt that the game was still there for us to be won. A rapid 3 wickets from Ned Arnold (3/7) opened the door for us, and the combination of some good fielding and our spin partnership of Xavier Tregeagle (3/24) and Harry Lee (2/1) were able to tighten the screws and ultimately win one of our most memorable come-from-behind victories in the U24s competition, bowling out Auburn for just 68.

In the second round, we faced North West Sydney, one of the stronger teams in recent years, at their home ground of Kanebridge Oval. Bowling first, we were able to put into practice our lessons learnt from Round-1, limiting NWS to 197 on a friendly wicket, thanks to Matthew Ropers' 4 wickets. In reply, we made steady work of the chase, winning 4 wickets down in the 39th over.

The third round brought us our first home game of the season, against Mount Pritchard Southern Districts at Rothwell Park. In front of a strong home crowd showing for Back to Briars Day, and after a shaky start, the middle order partnership of Gardner (81) and Lee (50) led us to a total of 233. In the field, the wickets were shared across the board, and we were able to bowl MPSD out for 164.

With a finals spot secured, we went into the final round of the season looking to consolidate a home semifinal against Balmain South Sydney. Batting first, Gardner and I were able to put on a record-breaking 3rd wicket partnership of 273, and Briars' second highest individual score in the competition of 169\* from Gardner. In response, BSS were only able post 52, thanks to Threlkeld's 5-wicket haul, securing first place and a record-breaking winning margin of 334 runs.

At the conclusion of the regular season, we finished first in the Thunder Conference, with 25 points.

The semi-final was played, once again, at Rothwell Park against defending joint-premiers Warringah. Winning the toss and batting first, we posted a defendable score of 190 in oppressively hot conditions, thanks to another outstanding innings from Gardner of 75\*. Unfortunately, the difficult heat during the day took its toll, and we lost several players to injury when taking the field. 

The highlight of the season was our Under 11s winning their grand final, becoming the first Briars Junior Rugby team to go back-to-back and only the third team in our history to take out a Junior Premiership.

We had 85 registered players this year comprising 75 boys and 10 girls with 33 volunteers generously donating their time in official roles to support our great club. Daniel's emotional presentation day speech embodied perfectly what it means to be a Briar and was inspirational to his captivated audience of junior players and parents.

A huge thanks to all our players and their families for being a part of Briars Junior Rugby this year.

Additionally, our success would not have been possible without our innovative committee who never wavered in their support, ensuring our club provided the best, most inclusive rugby experience possible and our many generous sponsors.

# J H Stone Trophy

#### Awarded to Scarlett Thuell

Scarlet is 20 years old (21 next month) and has played hockey for Briars for 12 years through Juniors and now in Seniors.

Scarlet has umpired for 6 years for Sydney Women's Hockey League (SWHL), Briars Summer Comp and Sydney East Hockey Association (SEHA) representative umpiring.

Scarlet entered the team coaching realm in 2022 coaching Junior rep teams in SEHA, dealing with young players and parents.

Scarlet provides umpiring coaching for junior umpires within Briars.

Scarlet also performs one of the Summer Comp night manager roles over the annual 10-week competition co-ordinating matches, umpires and running the canteen.

Scarlet undertook her RSA when she turned 18 to actively do rostered duties at the Cintra canteen.

#### **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE REPORTS**

#### General

This Summary of the Financial Statements has been derived from the full financial report of Briars at Greenlees Limited [**Briars**] for the year ended 30 September 2023. The discussion and analysis are based on those financial reports and is provided to assist members in the understanding of the financial statements.

A copy of the full financial report and audit report thereon will be made available to any member upon request to the General Manager.

#### Statement of Profit/(Loss) and Other Comprehensive Income

Briars total revenue of \$6,524,499 has increased by \$964,506 (17.35%) compared to last year [\$5,559,993], and operating expenses excluding depreciation, amortisation, and finance costs of \$5,357,678 has also increased by \$964,516 (21.95%) from last year [\$4,393,162], resulting in net profit before tax of \$297,714 [income tax: \$ Nil] compared to a 2022 profit of \$490,883 [income tax: \$ Nil].

Individual items and trading conditions that have impacted the 2023 result include:

- Club renovation work was completed this year together with the major upgrade of the gaming room. Both these projects impacted members of the Club and made trading conditions difficult but resulting in a positive revenue contribution to the Club, with bar sales increasing by \$194,959 [(14.27%) and net poker machine revenue increasing by \$445,425 (17.37%).
- Entertainment, marketing, and promotion expenses decreased by \$13,838 (3.40%).
- Depreciation and amortisation expense increased by \$175,469 [27.42%). The major categories impacting this increase
  were:
  - Building improvements +\$53,845
  - Furniture & Fittings +\$41,925
  - o Plant & Equipment +\$31,520
- Employee benefit expenses increased by \$144,030 (15.90%):
  - Employee costs increased following strong increases in bar and poker machine activity.
- Other expenses from ordinary activities increased by \$638,956 (30.54%) and spread across all expense items, but the major items were:

- Poker machine direct expenses [taxes and other expenses] increased by \$154,037 (33.98%] were offset by an increase
  in net poker machine clearances of \$445,425 (17.37%).
- Bar sales were strong at \$1,561,373 compared to last year of \$1,366,414. An increase of \$194,959 (14.27%):
  - The gross profit percentage increased from 61.01% to 63.32% (+2.31%).

#### Statement of financial position

Briars net assets have increased by \$297,714 or 4.38% since last year. This change consisted of:

- An increase in total assets of \$401,489; and
- An increase in total liabilities of \$103,775

The increase in net assets for the year is mainly attributable to:

- Net decrease in property, plant, and equipment of \$471,994 on the Right-of-use assets [ROU] following a review of the Clubhouse and grounds lease which is valued as a perpetuity.
- Net Increase in property, plant, and equipment of \$1,076,357 comprising renovations to the clubhouse, furniture and equipment, and new poker machines.

- Decrease in cash and cash equivalents of \$234,465. Call deposit utilized in payment of Club renovations.
- Increase in intangible assets \$63,006 on purchase of 2 new gaming entitlements.
- Trade and other payables decreased substantially by \$436,286 by a decrease of trade creditors and accruals.
- Increased in current provisions of \$291,558. Cricket development fund +\$120,000 and repairs and maintenance for the Burwood property +\$129,221 with employee provisions increasing by \$29,704.
- Other liabilities increased by \$248,194 mainly on an increase in deferred payments liabilities on purchase of poker machines, together with an increase in accruals.
- Decrease in non-current financial liabilities of \$625,368 attributable to the repayment of poker machines and gaming system, and review of the Clubhouse and grounds lease which is valued as a perpetuity.

#### Statement of cash flows

Operating activities provided net cash inflows of \$1,288,850 compared to \$1,455,053 last year. A decrease of \$166,203 (11.42%) due to cash being utilized in the Club's renovation projects.

Net cash used by investing activities of \$1,872,949 mainly related to the payment of clubhouse renovations, and property, plant, and equipment, together with the gaming room project.

Net cash inflow from financing activities of \$349,634 results from the partly drawdown CBA business loan to assist in the financing of the renovations and gaming room projects.

Cash at year end of the year was \$355,231 compared to \$589,696 last year. A decrease of \$234,465 (39.76%).
