

Chairman's Report

Brett Howle





On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to present this 19th Briars Sports Annual report to members for the period ending 30 September 2024.

After starting in 1918 and now with 107 years of existence, this past year has represented yet another year whereby Briars Sports has remained true to, and continues to build upon its core value, being the promotion and playing of amateur sport within our local community. Our 6 sports of cricket, rugby, hockey squash, bowls and netball have continued their success from previous years and provide well administered and well-respected sporting opportunities for boys and girls and men and women alike. As a community club we aim to be the club of choice in providing relevant and welcoming experience for all our members and guests.

Financially, the club has recorded a profit of \$189,612, compared to \$297,714 in 2023. This is a very pleasing result in terms of the current general economic environment and the recent introduction of a competitive impact. The club achieved an EBITDA of \$1,142,639 (2023: \$1,166,820), highlighting a strong trading performance. The Board is pleased with this result, especially given the factors previously mentioned. For a more detailed analysis of the club's financial performance, please refer to the Treasurer, Matina Moffitt's report.

This strong result allowed Briars Sports to provide our sports with a total of \$131,100 in grants during the year. These grants allow our sports many options, including to pay for coaches and equipment as required, and most importantly, to subsidise sporting fees, especially for our juniors' sports. The aim being to reduce the financial burden upon parents and to encourage juniors to take up or keep playing in their sports.

Additionally, the wider community also received grants totaling \$26,100 to various community organisations to allow them to continue to do what they do. Further details on this are detailed elsewhere in this report.

On the club front, it was a quiet year in terms of any major projects. Some minor works including the installation of a large TV screen to the outside play area and minor upgrades to the gaming area as required by legislation. That said, the Board is always looking forward and planning for future projects to enhance the experience for members and guests. Our General Manager Jason Parle provides greater detail on club matters over the last 12 months in his report.

Our sporting achievements during the year were many and varied as follows.

- Senior Cricket: Secured their 12th successive club championship and 2 premierships.
- Junior Cricket: Close to 40 sides competing and several premierships together with a significant and growing presence of female cricket.
- Senior Rugby: Best year for some time with a first-grade nail biting loss in the final. Make 2025 better again.
- Junior Rugby: Continues to grow and go from strength to strength.
- Women's Rugby: Another successful year with competitive results in their 7s competitions in various exotic locations worldwide.
- Hockey: A good if not overly successful year but with big things hoped for next year with planning well underway.

- Squash: Another successful year for our squashies, based at Thornleigh with plenty of successful results.
- Men's Bowls: A Pennants victory for one of the sides so it doesn't get better than that.
- Ladies Bowls: Always going well with pleasing numbers.
- Netball: A successful year with strong participation and results.

I encourage you to review the detailed sporting reports for a comprehensive overview of our individual sports results.

The success of both our club and our sports is a jigsaw of many pieces. However, an integral part of that jigsaw is our General Manager Jason Parle and his dedicated senior staff of Monique and Ben. Jason and his entire team are to be commended for their commitment to the success of our club and their ongoing work to ensure Briars Sports remains at the forefront of all our endeavors, be it on or off the field.

The core of the success of our sports rests with the respective Chairmen or Chairwomen that dedicate their volunteering efforts to the running of their sports. It is the efforts of these individuals and their executive team that make our sports the success they are. My sincere thanks to them for their efforts and to all the other volunteers that assist in the running of our sports. "Many hands make light work" is that old saying and the more people we have involved in the organisation of our sports the greater the chances of success and growth.

Our sports sponsors also play a critical role in the ongoing vitality and viability of our sports. Their commitments are greatly appreciated, and we thank them all for their ongoing contributions.

Canada Bay Council are a significant stakeholder in our existence and success. As one of the greatest sporting users of council facilities, during both summer and winter, our sports are most grateful for the quality of the fantastic facilities and sporting fields provided. We work closely with the council on many fronts and enjoy a progressive and productive relationship with the various council officers that our sports deal with and I thank them for their support.

Richard Davies as proprietor of our bistro "The Backyard", together with his staff are to be thanked for their contributions during the year. In challenging times Richard and his team have provided a consistently outstanding food offering for our members and guests.



It is with great pleasure I present to you the Treasurer's report for the year ended 30 September 2024.

The profit for the year was \$189,612 compared to the prior year result of \$297,714. The total net assets of the club remain healthy at \$7,288,096 as of 30 September 2024.

We continue the improvements for the club premises with \$238,000 spent in 2024. Our objective is to ensure we remain relevant to our members, and they can enjoy their time at the club.

In addition, the 2024 financial year profit does not include the profits made by the sports, which was \$260,625. These amounts are carried forward to 2024 to assist the sports with their upcoming seasons. The club continues to support our sports with grants of \$120,000 for the year.

Further details can be found in the summary financial report included in this annual report.

I would like to acknowledge our club members for their continued support. Also, a big thank you to all the volunteers who worked tiredly to ensure that the sports were able to take the field.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Jason Parle, our General Manager, the Briars management team Ben and Monique and my fellow directors for their huge contribution throughout the year that has seen the club continue to perform well in the current economic conditions.

General Manager's Report

Jason Parle



I am pleased to present this report as Club Manager for the fiscal year ending 30th September 2024. Over the past year, our club has continued to thrive, navigating the challenge of a new Club opening in our community yet continuing to trade very well.

To all the Sports within the Briars family, congratulations on your achievements throughout 2024, and thank you to our volunteers! Your dedication is what makes Briars the preferred Sports Club for both adult and junior participants.

The essence of our Club thrives through our sports, as we stand by each other in unwavering support.

Operational Highlights:

Facility Upgrades: The following upgrades were completed throughout the year:

- New display cabinet in the Ted Stockdale lounge
- Stage built in the Ted Stockdale lounge for the pulpit
- The pulpit was refurbished and placed on the stage in front of the new display cabinet
- Parkside decking area had greenery placed around it
- New high bar tables purchased for Parkside

- New bar stools purchased for Parkside
- · Ceiling fans installed on Parkside
- 6 x new Gaming machines were purchased
- Constant game conversions to keep the gaming room relevant

The Board of the Club undertook to tackle rising energy costs and, in September, a 99.44KW solar system was installed on the Club roof. This is forecast to save \$25,000 per annum with a payback of 3.5 years.

- The Club successfully applied for a \$25,000 energy efficiency grant. These funds were used to:
- Preventative maintenance of all refrigeration equipment
- · New evaporator for glass chiller
- New condensing unit kitchen cool room
- · New condensing unit keg cool room
- New condensing unit main bar
- New fans x 2 kitchen cool room
- Cool room door repairs including seals





Lachy's Long Run Home

Briars Rugby Lunch | Lachlan Cameron's Speech

During this year, Briars Rugby player Lachlan 'Sunshine' Cameron completed the incredible achievement of running from Brisbane to Sydney, aiming to be the fastest person to do so & achieving his goal. At the annual Rugby Lunch, Sunshine delivered a speech detailing the achievement, what drove him to complete the distance and his story. Below is this speech:



Good afternoon, everyone, my name is Lachy, and to be honest I'm.... well, I'm a very ordinary guy.

I'm from Sydney's inner west, I've been a tradie my whole life, I enjoy a beer ...or two with my mates and I was even a very average winger (who tried his heart out!) for our very own briars.

Most things about me are very ordinary! And of course, there is nothing wrong with that, but I bet you're all thinking well I didn't spend \$175 bucks for some bloke to bail me up down at Briars! I can do that for free most weekends!

No the reason I am up here today is I recently completed something that is definitely not ordinary that I can admit, currently I am fastest person to have ever run from Brisbane to Sydney, a 925 km journey that lasted 10 days 7 hours 50 minutes and 26 seconds, taking a day of the previous record and in the process my team and I raised 35 thousand dollars for a mental health charity called Heart On My Sleeve, honestly for me it's still hard to comprehend not only the

resilience I was able to show but more so the generosity showed by complete strangers which helped us raise much needed funds that will make a difference.

It took 18 months of unquestionable resolve in training for me to get to the start line in Brisbane, and whilst I've never had the belief that I'm an extraordinary runner probably based in that I'm not the fastest, the fittest and nor do I have perfect run form but what I do have though is the belief that I'm a fighter, I know that no matter the situation I will keep the gloves up. For me this was truly highlighted at the end of day 3, in terms of constant pain day 3 was definitely the worst of them all, but I just grit down on the teeth and somehow got to a finish 96km or 13 and a half hours later which had us completing just under 300km in 3 days, I remember sitting in the bus as we prepared to head to the motel for the night, I had just text my coach about our progress for the day and I was cracking jokes with the crew and smiling ear to ear from

pure elation and self-pride on another day of what felt like other worldly feats considering my very short running career, however that joy quickly turned into dismay as a dull throb started to engulf both of my knees, the dull only got faster and faster and more and more painful..... I remember being seated and rather immobile, but I was trying my best to move away from the pain but with no avail, once my body started lightly trembling, I remember asking my mate ash if this was me going into shock? Which I may have said with a small grin to try and lighten the mood but once again that was quickly evaporated as my body started to shake very dramatically.

And at that point.... Well at that point I was no longer the hero everyone had been looking at for past 3 days, all of the superpowers that had been attached to me vanished and I was simply a man....an ordinary man mentally and physically exhausted with a body riddled with overwhelming pain to the point that top end fight or flight had kicked in, I couldn't tell you exactly how long it all went on maybe 20 minutes I'm not sure however the laughter seemed like an eternity ago and you could hear a pin drop in the bus

I knew I needed to centre my thought pattern to simply focusing on my breath so I closed my eyes and with a consoling arm around me from ash we breathed it out, and although the shakes would get better and then worse we stayed calm and worked through the adversity, I remember when I stopped shaking I opened my eyes and there was a real recalibrating process, my vision was very blurred and I think I broke the world record for most blinks in minute.. but then I was back and although the lovely owner of the motel said I looked like a soldier coming home from war the lights were back on and I had a real choice fight or flight, now that was a tough moment for not only me, but everyone involved and understandably we could've said OK maybe this is too much,

However, that moment didn't sow the seeds of doubt, instead it reinforced just how much I really wanted it, and I was able to see the opportunity in the adversity and know that I was just faced with easily one of the toughest days and toughest moments of my life and I came out the other side. Because ultimately tough moments don't last, but tough people sure as hell do.

We had plenty more challenges throughout our journey whether that was the feeling of a vicious bang in my right Achilles on day 5, or the constant running repairs of tape which made me feel more mummy than ultra runner, maybe it was into shock again on day 7 or perhaps being kicked off the highway by transit NSW due to their safety concerns and me mentioning "but I've been on here for 8 days "weirdly not helping the situation, however for me I remember the beautiful moments, whether it was running down the highway with my mum and dad on her birthday which was also Mother's Day and all 3 of us belting out life is a highway with nothing but smiles on our faces for the beautiful moment we were a part of, or getting to meet my new little mates Josh and Lachy who are both legends and I hope in some way I inspired them to believe in themselves and the untapped reservoir of potential that lies dormant in us all, but for me the most humbling was my amazing crew, they were on every second of every day doing whatever was necessary to make my dream come true and I will forever be indebted to them all.

The run has changed my perception of not only myself but the world, the beauty that I now see in moments I would have previously taken for granted is something I'll forever be grateful for.

However it hasn't always been this way, the reason I mentioned the very average and ordinary parts of my life is there is probably a lot of people here who look at an extraordinary feat like this and think that it is only attainable by very few and believe that it is too hard to even comprehend so instead they will go down the route of never trying, I know what that looks like and I applied this method to my life for a very long time, I had massive self-worth issues which I then turned to drugs and alcohol to try and fill the void of which extrapolated the problems to the point where to be completely honest I didn't want to be here anymore.

Now those moments they aren't extraordinary, but what they are is real, real moments, from real Life, from a person that was suffering like so many of us do but wasn't able to be honest with others about how he felt and wasn't able to believe that he was worth putting in the work because even if I did start it's not like I'd be able to do anything worthwhile. Right?

Well that was my thought pattern until 3 years ago until one day I just decided that hey let's just believe in yourself enough to get out and want to be better whatever that looks like, so I strapped on the shoes and

went for a run and it was absolutely brutal no way around it, as it turns out all those years of being a degenerate don't really help long distance running..... who'd of thought.

But I stuck at it, as rough as it was and even though sometimes it felt like I was getting worse not better there was still the element of self-pride from getting out and wanting to do something positive for yourself whatever that looked like, and I grew and grew and grew to the point where I can stand in front of people now truly proud of the man I am not because of external opinions but the resume of hard work that I now have, a continued investment In myself which allows a much happier lifestyle which ultimately came from one moment where I decided I was worth the effort to get off the couch and try and be better.

At the end of the day all of the things I have said here, hopefully as powerful as they were are just words, what I have said doesn't determine what the rest of your life will look like because ultimately that will only ever be up to you, but my hope is that these words inspire a belief, a belief that the only difference between ordinary and extraordinary is the effort you are willing to put in to your life to find out where your destiny lies, because every time you go that extra mile, or even as simple as an extra step you are reinforcing to yourself that you are more than just ordinary, and before you know it all of that hard work will culminate into whatever your dream is, and to me that's pretty bloody extraordinary.

I'd like to finish with a quote from a song that I've always loved but became one of the real anthems of the run,

From Robbie Williams angels

"And down the waterfall wherever it may take me I know that life won't break me "

Everyone in this room either has or will be faced with adversity, that's just life, however it's not the pain nor hardships that you will be remembered by, it's how you chose to overcome and move forward that will etch your legacy and personally Instil knowledge as Robbie told us that life won't break us.

2024 has been a hell of a year, when considering the last 12 months because in Women's Rugby 7s it feels like we never stop.



We started the Spring season with a tournament win in Mudgee with our Maroon development side, where I think most of the prize money went back into the local community via the pubs in town that night

Our Dubai squad then headed to Byron Bay for some sun and surf, ohh and some footy. The stacked Gordon team full of NSW representative players talked themselves up then got smashed by Briars 17-0. The team learnt a lot about travelling together in that tournament which was going to be needed when we headed over to Dubai soon after.

The Dubai 7s tournament is the largest rugby festival in the world. If you ever get the opportunity to go we highly recommend it as a player or even a spectator. An amazing performance on the field and unfortunately, we played the real grand final in the semi-final against Great Britain's World Series reserve team. One little mistake in the game turned the tide and we finished 3rd overall in the tournament. If you want to see some of that journey, we were part of a documentary where they followed our

journey to the event. If you want to watch, it's called From Far & Wide on Rugby pass TV or in your onboard entertainment next time you are on an Emirates flight.

We came back together for 2024 with some new players, some players got picked up by Rugby League with promises of stardom and we began to look at what we could achieve for 2024. Some unfortunate results in tournaments early in the year and we focused on our next trip to Borneo. With the opportunity for some of those new players to experience rugby overseas we took a mix of new and experienced players across to Malaysia for an amazing experience. We ended that tournament winning the Bowl final (actually winning a glass bowl) but now seem to have a rivalry with the entire country of Uzbekistan. In 2025 we are headed back to finish that fight.

The team also notably played in the inaugural WX Shield pre-season competition, hosting teams on a Thursday night at Rothwell. We beat Two Blues and Merrylands but lost to Burra Rays in the Grand Final.

At this time, I want to thank our former coach Trent Eagle who took this team from a social team back in 2020 and worked hard alongside the players and club to create amazing opportunities for our players. Something that is very special and take a lot of hard work to achieve. After a very tough 12 months outside of rugby for Trent he took a step back to focus on his daughter and himself. Trent is still cheering for the team and I personally thank him for everything he did for me and everyone he coached in those 4 seasons.

We are already locked in to play in Singapore, Japan and Malaysia and we have something else in the works for our women's 7s program. 2025 will also see Briars Women's become part of the Saturday game day fixture as we launch our first XVs team as part of Premier Women's Rugby (equivalent of Shute Shield) and compete at that high level.

The preparation was finally over. After a significantly uplifted training program starting in September, including competing at the Byron Bay 7s tournament and twice weekly training, the team was now ready



to play against the best clubs in the world at the 2023 Emirates Dubai 7s.

The last training session had set the team values around the goal they had set: "Winning Dubai the Briars Way: Train Hard, Play Hard". They broke this down into clear values to work towards together to achieve their goal. These goals included focus at training, on game day and on the pitch with the all-important "Next Job" call to lift their heads and get on with the game.

The Briars Women's Rugby 7s team departed for Dubai in the early hours of the morning on Monday 27 November. A long 14-hour plane ride was ahead of them, but everyone was very excited to get over that there was not much rest on the flight.

Arriving in Dubai on Monday afternoon, the desert heat hit the team as they exited the airport for the team bus. The first highlight on the trip to our hotel was seeing the Dubai skyline and the Burj Khalifa rising from the desert, towering over the expansive city of Dubai. It was now a reality that the team were in town and

ready for the biggest 7s tournament in the world. A quick shower and we needed to stretch the legs. Where else but Dubai's Global Village - a vast food and shopping playground with a different section from each area of the world. Dubai. As a group we headed off to The Palm, which is a man-made island connected to the coastline. Half the team headed up the Palm View lookout after a monorail ride, whereas the rest of the team who had been to Dubai in 2022 found a lunch spot for us on a nearby beach.

Abu Dhabi is the capital of the UAE and also host to the famous Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque. It truly is an amazing piece of architecture, and we spent quite a bit of time admiring the building, with

Tournament Day 1

Game 1 - The first game was scheduled for 6:20pm, so a slow start to the day was in order. After lunch the



team prepared for the game ahead & travelled by bus to the stadium.

In a strong opening game Briars faced Cats 7s, the 2022 Dubai 7s Cup winners. Despite a messy start and an early Cats try, Taylah Watson's 90m run and Ameena Kanj's tackle sparked Briars' momentum. Pui San Lai added another try, while Emily Eden and Ameena Kanj secured two more in the second half. Solid defence and three conversions from Taylah Watson sealed a dominant victory.

Game 2 - Briars faced the UK's Savvy Pink Panthers in a late-night 9pm kick-off. An early steal gave Briars a chance to score, but a missed pass led to a turnover. Strong defence forced a knock-on, and Ameena Kanj capitalized with a try on the wing. The Panthers quickly responded, leveling the score at 7-7. Just before halftime, Taylah Watson's clever dummy delivered a crucial try and conversion, putting Briars up 14-7.

In the second half, Olympia Plummer's sideline run, and another Watson conversion extended the lead to 21-7. Despite losing a player to injury, Briars held strong, though the Panthers scored twice late, missing key conversions. Briars secured a hard-fought 21-17 victory.

Tournament Day 2

Game 3 - Briars started strong against CNCF, capitalizing on defensive pressure to score early with a 70m try by Ameena Kanj, converted under the posts. A forced error led to another try by Taylah Watson, and edge-to-edge passing set up Ruthie Mose-Aunei for a third before halftime.

In the second half, Jacinta Tui's 70m run, supported by Emily Eden, extended Briars' lead. CNCF fought back with two tries after penalties and a yellow card left Briars down a player. Despite a strong start, CNCF's late surge brought the game to a close at 24 - 10.

Game 4 - In their final pool game at sunset, Briars faced Five Os, the UK Police Rugby 7s team, in a physical contest. An early yellow card and unforced errors put Briars on the back foot, but Bianca Bennetts' 70m run opened the scoring. Five Os equalized with an 80m intercept try, leaving the game tied at halftime.

In the second half, Pui San Lai's 70m break and a conversion by Kate Mateffy put Briars ahead. Ameena Kanj added another try with a 50m run, though the conversion hit the crossbar. Despite strong defence, Five Os capitalised on penalties to score late, continuing a trend of last-minute tries against Briars.

Tournament Day 3

In their first knockout game, Briars faced the Black Panthers on Pitch 7, energized by a lively crowd. After a shaky start with rolling penalties, Briars regained control, with Kate Mateffy scoring a 50m try and converting it herself. The Panthers responded to level the score, but Briars struck back before halftime with a 50m inside run by Ameena Kanj, converted by Taylah Watson.

In the second half, despite handling errors and pressure from the Panthers, Briars capitalized on strong plays. Ameena Kanj added another 90m try, and Bianca Bennetts sealed the game with a 50m run, though the conversion hit the post. Briars secured a well-earned win to advance to the semi-final.

Briars faced the Hammerheads, another undefeated team, in a tough semi-final. The Hammerheads started strong, scoring twice early with sharp, wide play. 



The chanting and cheering were really something else.

We had been chasing the Panthers the entire game with the crowd on our side it was absolutely thrilling to watch. But by the end the Panthers put one more goal on us, 4-2, yet the team kept pushing. Right until the final whistle when the Panthers sealed the deal, ending the game 5-2. I have never been involved in such a dramatic game. It was equal parts the worst game I have seen yet the best. I have never seen so many highs and lows. Our supporters were legendary, which added to the wildness of the game. That was exactly what Grand Finals are made of. Thank you to the team for such an amazing experience this year. even though we lost the game it still felt like the perfect send off for our players who age out this year. I am looking forward to having them on my team in 2025.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE REPORTS

General

This Summary of the Financial Statements has been derived from the full financial report of Briars at Greenlees Limited [**Briars**] for the year ended 30 September 2024. The discussion and analysis are based on those financial reports and is provided to assist members in the understanding of the financial statements.

A copy of the full financial report and audit report thereon will be made available to any member upon request to the General Manager.

Statement of Profit/(Loss) and Other Comprehensive Income

Briars total revenue of \$6,064,457 has decreased by \$460,042 (7.05%) compared to last year [\$6,524,499], and operating expenses excluding depreciation, amortisation, and finance costs of \$4,921,817 has also decreased by \$435,862 (8.14%) from last year [\$5,357,679], resulting in net profit before tax of \$189,612 [income tax: \$ Nil] compared to a 2023 net profit of \$297,714 [income tax: \$ Nil].

Individual items and trading conditions that have impacted the 2024 result include:

- Club trading conditions during the year became difficult flowing from the cost-of-living impact on the Australian economy
 and resulted in a negative impact on revenue at the Club, with bar sales decreasing by \$73,844 (4.73%) and net poker
 machine revenue decreasing by \$336,182 (11.17%).
- Entertainment, marketing, and promotion expenses increased by \$43,203 (10.98%).
- Depreciation expense increased by \$72,677 [8.91%). The major categories impacting this increase were:
 - o Furniture & Fittings +\$22,518
 - Poker machines +\$20,166
 - o Building improvements +\$17,174
 - Plant & Equipment +\$11,072
- Employee benefit expenses decreased by \$29,521 (2.81%):
 - Employee costs decrease resulted from the net of wages increases offset by reduced management positions.
- Other expenses from ordinary activities decreased by \$367,266 (13.45%) and spread across all expense items, but the major items were:

- Poker machine direct expenses [taxes and other expenses] decreased by \$51,255 (8.44%] as a direct result of the decrease in net poker machine revenue and flow-on with a drop in poker machine duty.
- Bar sales were down at \$1,487,529 compared to last year of \$1,561373. A decrease of \$73,844 (4.73%):
 - o The gross profit percentage increased marginally from 63.32% to 63.59%.

Statement of financial position

Briars net assets have increased by \$189,612 or 2.67% since last year. This change consisted of:

- An increase in total assets of \$407,597; and
- An increase in total liabilities of \$217,985

The increase in net assets for the year is mainly attributable to:

- Net increase in property, plant, and equipment of \$686,060 on the Right-of-use assets [ROU] following a review of the Clubhouse and grounds lease which is valued as a perpetuity.
- Net decrease in property, plant, and equipment of \$524,529 comprising work-in-progress, furniture and equipment, and new poker machines, net of depreciation \$781,966.
- Increase in cash and cash equivalents of \$111,920. Transfer of funds to CBA call deposit.
- Increase in intangible assets \$124,000 on purchase of 4 new gaming entitlements.
- Decrease in current financial liabilities on repayment of borrowing totalling (\$695,196). Offset by.
- Increase in non-current financial liabilities following reassessment of the perpetuity value of clubhouse land and grounds [ROU asset] \$758,260 net of payment on lease liabilities and borrowings totalling \$192,977.
- Decreased in current provisions of \$114,930. Repairs & Maintenance [Burwood property] provision \$129,221 and Cintra turf development fund provisions increasing by \$15,000.
- Other liabilities increased by \$420,425 mainly resulting from a NSW Sports grant of \$418,630 for the resurfacing of the synthetic grass at the Cintra hockey complex.

Statement of cash flows

Operating activities provided net cash inflows of \$1,453,404 compared to \$1,288,850 last year. An increase of \$164,554 (12.77%) due to a large grant of \$418,630 [net of GST].

Net cash used by investing activities of \$381,437 mainly related to the payment for property, plant and equipment and the purchase of four gaming entitlements.

Net cash outflow from financing activities of \$960,047 included the repayment of the CBA business loan \$631,699. This is a temporary measure pending commencement of the Cintra hockey complex resurfacing project.

Cash at year end of the year was \$457,151 compared to \$355,231 last year. An increase of \$111,920 (31.51%).
